



**GRIN #1929 - Weds 3rd May 2017: THE HC FOUNDATION – Grants for charitable organisations and individuals for social welfare and educational causes (applications may be made in writing at any time)**

Today's bulletin features a couple of little known grant-making trusts that you're unlikely to find listed in any directories.

The H C Foundation is a charity (no. 1148306) registered in 2012 with the following charitable objectives:

- o The advancement of education by providing and assisting in the provision of appropriate facilities required for such purposes;
- o The relief of financial hardship, poverty and sickness by making grants of money for providing or paying for items, services or facilities, or providing such persons with goods or services which they could not otherwise afford through lack of means; and
- o Such other charitable purpose as the trustees may from time to time authorise.

Grants are awarded across England.

The Foundation's expenditure on grants has varied between £128,000 and £282,000 during the four years since it was registered with the Charity Commission.

Grants made during the year ending 31 March 2016 totalled £152,326 (2015: £264,490).

The Foundation does not maintain a website.

**THE LORD COCKFIELD MEMORIAL TRUST – Grants for educational purposes (applications may be made in writing at any time)**

The Lord Cockfield Memorial Trust is a registered charity (no. 1123996) formed in 2007 with the general charitable objectives of providing grants "in any part of the world as the Trustees may in their discretion think fit".

Awards are made throughout England and the Isle of Man to other registered charities or voluntary groups. Many of the Trust's previous major awards indicate a strong connection to the Isle of Man.

During the year ending 5 April 2016 the Trust allocated £123,400 in grants, which appears to be a fairly consistent level of grant-giving.

Awards included £43,400 for special equipment to assist children and young people and Previous awards have included:

- o [Southern 100 \(Motorcycle racing on the Isle of Man\)](#) (£10,000);
- o [The National Trust - White Cliffs of Dover Appeal](#) (£50,000);
- o [The Manx Festival](#) (£20,000); and
- o [DASH \(formerly Berkshire East & South Bucks Women's Aid\)](#) (£10,000).
